Compliance Rail by July 2023


- Generally high compliance rates for electrification was further improved in DK to 53% and 93% for the entire corridor
- Track gauge 1435 mm available on 95% of the corridor rail km despite in FI but exempted, to to "isolated network"
- Intermodal gauge >= P/C 70/400 improved in IT to 28% and thus 70% in total
- Maximum freight train operating speed >= 100 km/h worsened in SE and IT to a total of 89%
- Maximum axle load >= 22.5 tons with no change and high rate of 92%
- Maximum train length >= 740 m improved slightly in SE and IT but still only 48% in total.

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- Update requested only for KPI "Connection Rail" according to Art. 41(3) of Regulation 1315/2013
- MLA exempted according to Art. 57 of Regulation (EU) 1315/2013
- TKU, GOT, MMX, NAP
 with no connection to rail but
 are not "main airports" according to
 part 2 of Annex II of Regulation
 (EU) 1315/2013
- Thus 100% compliance already before





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The Öresund Metro - a cross-border light rail metro on the ScanMed Corridor connecting the Urban Nodes of Malmö and Copenhagen

- A cross-border light rail metro connecting Malmö and Copenhagen
- Drilled tunnel under the seafloor of the Öresund strait
- 23 minutes from Malmö C to Copenhagen
- Departures up to every 90 seconds.
- Enhances capacity for additional freightand long-distance trains on TEN-T ScanMed Corridor and on the Öresund bridge.
- Expands cross-border labor market from 1,3 mio. to 2,3 mio. people (app.)





Current planning processes in Sweden and Denmark

SE: State public inquiry on capacity and redundancy across the Öresund strait

SE: Malmö is planning for urban lines and metro stations in Malmö

DK: Environmental impact assessment for a new M5 metro line in Copenhagen, includes a bifurcation chamber for a possible connection to Malmö.

DK: Screening analysis for future metro lines within Copenhagen, neighboring municipality and to Malmö.

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


